## Changing system locale

If the user wants to use a different language/character set (say Turkish) than the installed language of Windows (say English), it is **NOT** enough to go to the "Region and Language" control panel and just change the Format and add a new keyboard for the desired language. There's an additional setting called "system locale" or "language for non-Unicode programs" that needs to be changed for the analysis engine to be able to recognize special characters of the desired language/character set. The analysis engine won't be able to open or create files if the character set used in file/folder names is different than the language for non-Unicode programs.
